The Caledonian Forest

A I am looking at a photograph of Scotland, taken from one of its high mountains, looking down onto a dark lake, and hills stretching into the distance towards the sea. In the golden autumn sunshine, a pair of brightly colored birds have found a safe hiding place to make their home among the grasses and flowers that cover the ground. But there are no trees.

B It was not always so. Until a few hundred years ago, much of Scotland was part of the Caledonian Forest, a huge area of woodland of ancient trees and wildlife. In time, the forest began to be cleared to make farms, and in the 18th century, even more of the trees were cut down to build ships. Less than 5% of the original forest is now left.

C Charities, businesses and other organizations have ambitious plans to try and bring the forest back. Anders Holch Povlsen, a Danish billionaire, is a big supporter of the ideas – and as the biggest landowner in the UK, he is someone who can make a difference.

D He has already started work on some of the countryside that he owns. Once he had protected it from sheep – because they eat young trees – he started the planting project. In the past few years, his Scottish team have planted more than four million new trees.

E Povlsen, however, is not thinking about this year or the next. He is thinking about the way Scotland will look 200 years from now, when the forests have come back and can live on without human help. They will provide a home for Scotland's wildlife, for bears, wolves and other animals, and the trees will help the environment by storing carbon and helping to slow down climate change.

F Some people argue that bringing back the Caledonian Forest is not the answer to Scotland's problems. Dr Jim Hunter, a professor at the University of the Highlands and Islands, thinks more should be spent on people and jobs rather than trees. Povlsen, however, believes that tourism and environmental work will bring lots of job opportunities, and it should be possible to have both employment and a beautiful country to live in.

Notes:

1 The opening sentence says that Sarah ‘saw something up ahead’.

You will need to explain what it was. Was it an animal? Was it a person? Was it something like a house or a farm? Was it another car? Was it smoke from a fire? This will probably be the most important thing you choose because it will affect the rest of your story. You may need to use the past continuous for describing the scene: The sun was shining ... / There was a warm wind blowing ... / There was a man sitting ...

2 Your story will probably need to include a few details about who the main characters are. Are they tourists? Do they live there? You may need to use the past perfect to talk about things that happened before the opening moment of the story: We had hired the car that morning ... / We had only been in the country for a few days ...

3 Your story will probably need to talk about the events that happened next. For this, you will probably need to use the simple past tense: I stopped the car and jumped out ... / I ran down the road ..

4 At the end of the story you will need a sentence that finishes it off. For example: It was a day that I will never forget. / Even today, I can’t believe how lucky we were to escape.

However, remember that you only have a maximum of 100 words, so keep your story very simple.
